



Why NPR in Practice? → Communication


- conveying intentions or characteristics
 - intention to discuss designs
 - status as an idea, draft, or rough design





Why NPR in Practice? → Communication

- conveying information that is otherwise hidden
 - domain expertise made understandable for lay people
 - showing information that can otherwise not be seen




Why NPR in Practice? → Other Goals

- technically better suited (re: halftoning)
- illustration in domains where otherwise not feasible
- visualization of additional properties
- alternative form of depiction
- conveying a certain style of depiction
- artistic experimentation or expression
- just for fun
- ...
















